First of all, we are pleased to announce that KOSD has been awarded the Office of Refugee Resettlement (ORR)'s Ethnic Community Self Help Grant for another three years! With an increased overall budget, KOSD nearly doubled its original office space and has started some new programs for women's empowerment, senior engagement, and economic self-sufficiency.

KOSD was first awarded the Ethnic Community Self-Help Grant three years ago. Since then KOSD has provided more than 500 individuals with essential case management services, 200 youth with a wide variety of youth-focused programs, and a job development program to 150 individuals. Also, during the past 3 years, there were more than 15,000 office visits for individual case management issues and job development programs alone.

To celebrate these successes and look forward to the next year of organizational growth, more than 300 community members and supporters gathered on November 11, 2014 to celebrate KOSD's 3 Year Anniversary. Community leaders and

youth leaders gave all of us encouragement to keep moving forward as a community- and everybody enjoyed home-made traditional foods from Burma. Thank you so much everybody for your continuous support. Your support, thoughtfulness, encouragement, positive energy, and smile means a lot to KOSD. KOSD will keep moving forward with all of you in this beautiful community!



KOSD Retreat with Board, Staff, and Leaders

September 28, 2014

KOSD hosted a retreat on September 28, 2014 to plan for our continued growth. Board members, staff, community leaders, and youth leaders gathered in Jamul, where KOSD has received a donation of 2.5 arable acres of land for use as a culturally appropriate job development program (G.R.O.W.I.N.G Program). With a wonderful facilitator, Liz Shear from the University of San Diego, our group clarified our vision for the future.

Youth focused on how to deepen ties with their parents, improve their

education, and improve the whole community. Community Leaders focused on how they can work together to create even better self-help system in the community. And, KOSD board and staff discussed how we can all work together to improve and even expand various KOSD programs. All of us had the same wish; we want to keep KOSD running in coming years.

As you can see in our retreat, KOSD is a community organizations where board, staff, community leaders, and youth leaders have been working together to bring better programs and visions for the community. This is exactly why KOSD is unique, and why KOSD has been such an important part of the community of refugees from Burma in San Diego.
